MRS. WILD'S CLASSROOM NEWS

5th Grade Homeroom News~

This school year is wrapping up very quickly! We have just under 4 weeks left of school. Please make sure you are checking your child's grades and helping them to complete any missing work.

Remember we live in Wisconsin, some days it is cold and some days it is warm. It is better to have the kids bring a coat just in case it is needed. They must wear one if it is below 50 at the time we go outside, 50-60 they must have sleeves (coat, long sleeves, sweatshirt, etc), only above 70 degrees are they allowed to wear shorts, and NO sleeveless shirts!

Continue to encourage your child to work on their 4th Quarter Memory Work. We have started practicing for track. We practice everyday for about 20-30 minutes at the end of the school day. It would be helpful if your child had tennis shoes/running shoes to bring to school as we run outside at times. You do not need anything special but I do not want the kids running in crocs so just a pair of tennis shoes is perfect for them to change into.

5th Grade ELA ~ Students finished their <u>Hatchet</u> projects last week. Our next novel will be one chosen by each student. They need to pick a book they have not read before and there are certain guidelines to what they may select. They need to have their book at school on Monday. About half of the students have chosen their book and I have approved it, the other half still need to have it approved by me. They will be reading this book at school so they need it here everyday! Students will be reading some short nonfiction stories and working on answering questions about what they read to work on comprehension and looking back for important information and details. Students have been given information on Living History Night and will begin working on their writing. This will be a combined Social Studies and ELA assignment. They are also writing an opinion paper.

7th/8th Grade ELA ~ Students in 8th grade finished reading <u>Projekt 1065</u> by Alan Gratz. They will start one last book this coming week. In 7th grade students are reading a book of their choice and finishing a project with their book. They will also read one more book before the end of the year and we will start the book this week. Please help remind your child to bring their book to school because they do read in class every day. They are going to begin working on a fairy tale. Students will be writing an informational piece about an important/famous military man or woman. This will be a combined Social Studies and ELA assignment.

Spelling is Unit 34 this week. All words are posted in the students' Google Classroom for this week. Students' assignments are posted in Google Classroom as well. Spelling Pre-Test will be on Thursday and the test for those that do not get 100% on the Pre-Test will be on Friday. (This is our 2nd last week of spelling!)

MRS. STEINER'S CLASSROOM NEWS

5th Grade Math - We finished up topic 13 on Friday. We will test on this topic on Monday. The remaining topics we have are all about 4 lessons long, so don't be surprised if you feel like we are moving quickly. We start topic 14 on Tuesday. This topic focuses on the coordinate plane and graphing points.

6th Grade Math - We will be reviewing and testing on topic 7 this week. The test will be on Wednesday. We will then start on our topic 8. This topic focuses on statistical questions and using mean, median, mode, and range.

8th Grade Math - Both courses will have a pretest and test this week. Test on Wednesday. Course 3 will then have an investigation on Thursday on sampling methods for surveys. Algebra will have an investigation on different methods of factoring. Course 3 will end the week with a lesson on the effect of scaling on perimeter, area, and volume. Algebra will have a lesson on solving absolute-value inequalities.

Fourth Quarter Math Projects - All upper grade math classes are doing a creative project for the 4th quarter. This is our final math project for the school year. We'd like to have these items on display during the Living History Night (May 10th) so projects are due <u>May 8th</u>. Here's the information for you: <u>4th Quarter Math Pro-</u><u>ject</u>. I have books for students to look through and paper for them to use. If we need other materials please let me know.



Being active is important to me. I like to swim, take walks, and run with our


dog. Our family likes to camp and vacation together. I consider myself a lifelong learner and enjoy taking classes to acquire new skills and develop interests.
