## MRS. WARNKE'S, MRS. KURBIS'S & MRS. EHLERT'S CLASSROOM NEWS

We had a wonderful week together and are looking forward to another filled with curiosity, joy, and growth! This week, our class will be exploring many exciting areas of discovery:

- **Bible Story:** We will learn how God saved Noah and his family, reminding children of God's power, promises, and care for His people.
- **Literacy:** Children will be introduced to the letters H and I while practicing alliteration through playful words, sounds, and actions.
- **Math:** Children will practice estimating quantities before counting, helping them build number sense and problem-solving skills.
- **Science:** Children will explore magnets by testing classroom objects, sorting them into magnetic and non-magnetic categories, and noticing patterns.

#### This week in Kindergarten:

### MISS ELLINGBOE'S CLASSROOM NEWS

#### 6th ELA

We will be in Unit 4 for spelling. Students will be working on the short o sound, and the long o sound. The words this week are: oppose, associate, video, constant, approach, pose, positive, contact, opportunity, charcoal, donate, stereo, beyond, emotion, notice, opposite,, project, respond, bronze.

#### 7th Grade Math

We are having our first test of the year this week! This topic we have focused on integers and rational numbers. We have learned and practiced how to add, subtract, multiply, and divide using these numbers. Our next topic is focusing on rates and unit rates. 1

#### 8th Grade Math

We are wrapping up our last few lessons in our first topic this week. We are working on writing scientific notation. We will still use our rules on multiplying and dividing exponents while written in scientific notation.
