MRS. WARNKE'S, MRS. KURBIS'S & MRS. EHLERT'S CLASSROOM NEWS

We are looking forward to another exciting week of learning and discovery in Pre-K! Each day will bring new opportunities for your child to explore, create, and grow.

Bible Story: This week, we will hear how *God Helps David Kill Goliath*. Children will learn how God gives courage and strength, and how He helps His people in amazing ways.

Literacy: We will focus on the letters **B** and **C**, along with practicing **alliteration** by listening for words that begin with the same sound.

Math: Our class will explore measuring by **estimating quantities**. Children will make guesses and compare them to actual amounts to build early measurement skills.

Science: We will investigate **magnets** this week, discovering what they stick to, how they move objects, and what makes them unique.

Music: Children will explore volume, experimenting with loud and soft sounds using instruments and their voices.

Art: This week's art focus is **tearing**, allowing children to strengthen fine motor skills while using ripped paper to create textured artwork.

P.E.: We will practice **bouncing** and **dribbling** as we work on early basketball skills, including using the **hoop** for simple shots.

This week in Kindergarten:

Christ Light(Bible Story) - We are going through the Old Testament in Christ Light. Moses is now God's leader of the Isralites in the desert. We will see how God provides for his people as he leads them back to the promised land.

MISS ELLINGBOE'S CLASSROOM NEWS

5th Grade Math

This week we are starting fractions!! This topic will be focused on adding and subtracting fractions and learning the vocabulary to each part of a fraction.

6th Grade Math

We are reviewing and testing this week on solving algebraic equations using opposite operations.

6th FI A

We will be getting back into our novel this week. There are so many more discoveries that our characters, Doon and Lina, will uncover. Be sure to ask your child about it at home!

We will be in unit 15 for spelling this week, which looks at suffixes -ed and -ing. Students will be completing pages 83, 84, and 87 in their workbooks. The spelling words for this week are: complained, profiting, excelling, profited, obtaining, remaining, admitted, resulting, complaining, directed, resulted, excelled, directing, permitting, remained, obtained, differing, permitted, admitting, and differed.

The students will have a reading log to complete this week. Please encourage them to do a little bit as they read their 20 minutes every night. Students also have the option to type up their reading logs in the Google Classroom, or write it out on the paper copy. Please reach out to me if there is a way that you prefer them to have it done. I really appreciate your support in helping your children become better readers and writers!

7th Grade Math

We will continue our work with writing equivalent algebraic equations and solving them using opposite operations.

8th Grade Math

We are continuing to analyze the data on scatter plots and write the relationships we find from them.

MR. VANDENBERG'S CLASSROOM NEWS

5th grade social studies will evaluate the effect of slave codes on the lives of African captives, analyze how the plantation system affected development of slavery, explain the economic patterns and major industries of colonial America, describe the development of the free enterprise system in colonial America, and explain why American colonists began to develop their own governments.

6th grade social studies will describe the battles of the gladiators, explain how the government stopped uprisings when food was short, and review the job of the Roman officials in the territories they conquered and connect how the job led to Jesus' death.

7th and 8th grade social studies will understand the factors that led to WWI, describe how the early fighting progressed in Europe, describe how Americans responded to the war in Europe, explain what led to American involvement in the war, describe what was happening in Europe when the US entered the war, and understand the role American troops played in the fighting.
