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MRS. LAWONN'S CLASSROOM NEWS

Well that was a whirlwind of a week. "Delicious" stone soup on Friday, a weekend, a day of professional development with new ideas (more on that later), then three days with standardized testing, and then a cold day!

Let's start with that soup, shall we? Everyone brought something to share (the real point of the story) and enjoyed dumping it in one of the crockpots. The teacher learned that broccoli should not be overcooked with peppers unless a pungent odor is wanted for days afterwards.. The children declared that the soup was delicious AFTER adding salt and cheese and realizing that it was literally supposed to taste like vegetables.. Will definitely do this lesson again!

My new idea was to really teach "morphology." What is that weird word, you ask? I explained it as the study of words. This time we didn't go into the origin of the word, but spent time looking to find words in the word. The hope is that by making different connections and seeing parts of the word that children can read the new word. It was explained to me like a filing cabinet. You know the word is in the drawer, but you have to dig a little bit to find it. Some of my readers loved it. Parents - definitely something to try instead of "sound it out" because you know that won't always work (side note - it can be fun to try sounding out words that won't work, such as because for instance. Yes, I see you with your tongue out.... ;))

This week we are all looking forward to normalcy and routine. We will be learning about hot air balloons in reading, science, and social studies. I loved teaching this unit last year and I have more resources this year. Learning here we come!

MRS. WILD'S CLASSROOM NEWS

5th Grade Homeroom News ~

If you have not signed your child's report card envelope please do so and return to school. Kids Heart Challenge is underway. I have encouraged all of the students to sign up even if they are not going to raise money. There are some fun activities and health games/activities the students can do online.

5th Grade ELA ~ Students started working on different activities based on their writing and reading skills. Students are reading different books depending on which group they are in. As a class our read aloud book is *Heroes* Students will be working on a "Monster Tale" which is a short writing piece that will also get entered into a contest in addition to an assignment. For spelling we will take the post-test for unit 21 on Monday at the start of ELA class.

7th/8th Grade ELA ~ In 7th grade students are reading *The Door in the Dragon's Throat* and in 8th grade they are reading *The Secret of the Desert Stone*. The 7th grade read aloud is *Snoop* and in 8th grade the read aloud is *Drums, Girls, and Dangerous Pie* We started working on informative writing. Once a week students will start to write in cursive in their journals to maintain their cursive writing skills and continue to improve that skill. Students in 8th grade will have their spelling post-test for unit 21 at the start of ELA class.

Spelling is Unit 22 this week. All words are posted in the students' Google Classroom for this week. Students' assignments are posted in Google Classroom as well. Spelling Pre-Test will be on Thursday and the test for those that do not get 100% on the Pre-Test will be on Friday.

Re-Enrollment Instructions

FOR CURRENT CHOICE STUDENTS

2026-2027 Open Enrollment – February 2, 2026

DON'T WAIT. YOUR CHILD'S CHOICE SEAT IS NOT GUARANTEED IF YOU WAIT.

Each year, parents must complete the Online Parent Application via the DPI portal to continue receiving a choice voucher. Monthly application periods are available, starting in February, **but your child's spot is not guaranteed if you wait**. Seats fill monthly, **after the first enrollment period, seats may be given to new applicants depending on availability**. Applying early gives your child the best chance at securing their seat for the 2026-27 school year.

Follow these steps for an easy guide on how to renew your choice application.

1 Obtain an acceptable* **proof of address** document.



***ACCEPTABLE DOCUMENTS:**

- Wage statement
- Signed and current lease agreement
- Property tax bill
- Utility bill (water, electric, gas, cable or landline phone)
- Government correspondence

Document must:

- List address
- Include name(s) of parent(s) or guardian(s)
- Be dated within three (3) months of the start of open enrollment

2 Sign-in to the [online application](#) as a returning user using the email address and password from last year to complete the Online Parent Application.



If you do not remember your password, use the "Forgot your password?" link on the sign-in page. Your password will be sent to the email registered.

3 Verify the information entered is current, update information if needed and submit application.



Information entered on your application must match with your proof of address (e.g., name, address).

4 Check for email confirmation of application submission from the Department of Public Instruction.



5 Provide proof of address **to each school listed on your application, during the same open application period** or the application is ineligible.

Contact the school(s) listed on your choice application and ask them the best way to deliver proof of address.

Schools may accept documents:

1. In person
2. Email/Text
